- I love being there to guide him as he takes on new challenges and helping him find ways to succeed in life.












OUR LOVE STORY

Along with our hobbies, we have a lot of favorite traditions we share throughout the year, such as:


- 1. Carving pumpkins for Halloween and then dressing up to trick-or-treat around town!

- 8. Finding or baking a birthday cake that matches our little man's interests and then having a party with a few family and friends.










